DEPARTMENTAL HONORS PROGRAM:

Students seeking to graduate with "Honors in Economics" through intense investigation of a particular topic in economics may do so in the honors program. Eligibility is judged by the student's qualifications and availability of appropriate supervising professors. The supervisor works individually with the student over a two term sequence, 50:220:396-495-496, during the student's last two terms before graduation. Total credits earned are determined by the department according to the nature of the project; a grade is not given until completion of the two term sequence and departmental approval of an honors thesis embodying the project. Interested students should contact their academic advisors.

STUDENTS SHOULD NOTE that Independent Study courses are offered at the discretion of the department, and at the discretion of faculty involved in the project. All independent study projects require at least the same rigors of training, instruction, research, and grading as do other upper-division economics courses. To enroll in 50:220:491, students must have completed nearly all of the course requirements for the major in economics and have achieved a grade-point average of at least 3.0.
