Grades of D. A student may satisfy a specific requirement with a grade of D, but the credits for that course may not be included in the 36 required for the major. Any Department of English course may be taken to make up the deficit.

Students may earn certification for a minor program within the department by completing 18 credits in that field. English majors may count as many as 6 credits toward both an English major and one specific English minor, in which case only 12 additional credits need be earned.
